## Disposes of a Large Fortune.

I, Mary E. Hawley, of the town of Newtown, County of Fairfield, and State of Connecticut, being of sound and disposing mind and memory and of lawful age, do hereby make this as and for my last will and testament, revoking and annulling any and all wills or codicils by me at any time herebefore made.

1. I direct the payment of my just debts, funeral charges and expenses of administration by my executors hereinafter named, all taxes, state or federal, to be paid in accordance with directions hereinafter given by my said executors.

2. I give, devise, and bequeath to my cousins, Jane Maria Hawley, Theodore S. Hawley, Margaret Hawley and Albert Hawley, children of Walter Hawley, late of Santa Barbara, California, deceased, the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars each to be theirs absolutely.

3. I give, devise, and bequeath to my cousins, George H. Hawley, Addie Hawley, Stuart S. Hawley, Imogene Hawley and Caroline Hawley, children of George T. Hawley, late of Oakland, California, deceased, the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars each to be theirs absolutely.

4. I give, devise and bequeath to my cousin, Edna H. Roper and Harriet H. Miller, children of Edward A. Hawley, late of Bridgeport, deceased, the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars each to be theirs absolutely.

5. I give, devise and bequeath to my cousins, Annie E. Sanford and Sarah R. Deers, daughters of Henry Sanford, late of Newtown, Connecticut, deceased, the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars each to be theirs absolutely.

6. I give, devise and bequeath to Henry Sanford - Beers and Robert Edmund Beers, children of Sarah E. Beers, the sum of five thousand (\$5,000) dollars each to be theirs absolutely.

7. I give, devise and bequeath to Marie B. Meyer and Ed Meyer of Dresden, German, daughters of Otto P. Meyer, deceased, formerly of Newtown, Connecticut, the sum of five thousand (\$5,000) dollars each to be theirs absolutely.

8. I give, devise and bequeath the following sums to my employee hereinafter named as a token in reward of their faithful services, said sums to be theirs absolutely:

To Patrick H. Gannon of New Haven, Connecticut, I give the sum of ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars.

To Johanna Corbett of Newtown, Connecticut, I give the sum of five thousand (\$5,000) dollars.

To John J. Carmody of New Haven, Connecticut, I give the sum of two thousand (\$2,000) dollars.

To Marie R. Lillis, Mary Keating, William S. Lillis and Thomas Griffin, I give the sum of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars.

9. I give, devise and bequeath to my friend, Neille J. Tucker of Sandy Hook, Connecticut, the sum of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars to be hers absolutely.

10. I give, devise and bequeath to the Town of Newtown in the County of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, the sum of two hundred thousand (\$200,000) dollars for the purpose of erecting a new Town Hall and, if necessary, acquiring land for a site therefor, in said Town of Newtown, said town hall to be known as "The William Edmond Town Hall" in memory of my great grandfather, William Edmond. I desire that provision be made in said building for suitable offices and vaults for Town Clerk of said town and the Judge of Probate of the District in which said town is situated.

"Booth Library" in memory of my grandfather, provision to be made in said library, among other things, for a Historical room or rooms, said library to be open for public use at all reasonable times every afternoon and evening, including Sundays, and at such other times as may be deemed by the town reasonable and proper.

I authorize my executors in the exercise of their discretion to cause to be placed in said Historical rooms such of my antique furniture, furnishings and family portraits as to them shall seem fit and proper and to take such steps as in their discretion may be necessary to have same kept therein permanently.

I also give, devise and bequeath the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund to be known as "The Marcus Clinton Hawley and Sarah Booth Hawley Fund". In memory of my father and mother, and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Bridgeport Hospital, of Bridgeport, Connecticut, for the general uses and purposes of said hospital.

I also give, devise and bequeath to the said Bridgeport Hospital, of Bridgeport, Connecticut, the sum of fifty thousand (\$50,000) dollars to endow, establish and maintain free beds in said hospital in the use and occupancy of which preference is to be given to the residents of the town of Newtown.

11. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund to be known as "The Cyrenius H. Booth Fund" and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the town of Newtown, aforesaid, for the maintenance, support and upkeep of "The Cyrenius H. Booth Library" aforesaid, including the purchase of books and supplies therefor, and for the care and upkeep of the library building and the grounds appurtenant thereto and such other expenses in connection with the use and upkeep of said library as may be said town deem necessary or desirable. The trustee shall not in the administration of said fund be required to see to the application of said payments of income by it to said town.

12. I give, devise and bequeath to the town of Newtown the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to be expended in the erection and completion of a Soldiers' Monument to perpetuate the memory of soldiers and sailors in the Revolutionary, Civil War and the World's War, said monument to be erected on the site formerly occupied by the North Center school house on Newtowm street in said town of Newtown.

13. If at the time of my death I shall be engaged in the construction of any said buildings, viz: The Town Hall, Free Public Library or the Soldiers' Monument, my executors to erect which have been heretofore provided in the will for the town of Newtown, I direct my executors to complete the same at the expense of my estate, following so far as shall seem suitable to them, in their discretion the plans, if any, existing therefor. I authorize my executors in the discretion to change such plans and so far as there shall not be any plans, I direct my executors to provide the same in their discretion. In the event said building or monument, or any of them, shall have been erected and completed during my lifetime, or otherwise provided for before my death, then and in that event the provisions for the erection thereof made in this will shall be void as to such as shall have been completed or for which provision shall have been made, but the provision for the support and maintenance thereof shall stand as herein made, unless specific provision in lieu thereof shall have been made by me before my death.

14. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of thirty-five thousand (\$35,000) dollars in trust, for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee to the Connecticut Children's Aid Society, incorporated in 1890, for the general uses and purposes of said Society.

15. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the American Bible Society, New York City, for the general uses and purposes of said Society.

16. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Connecticut State Park and Forest Commission of said state, and I request, but do not direct, that so far as possible said sum be expended in connection with the uses and purposes of said Commission now or to be hereafter effected in Fairfield County where I reside.

17. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000) dollars in trust, for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, Incorporated under the laws of Massachusetts in 1812, for the general uses and purposes of said Board.

18. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, Incorporated under the laws of Massachusetts in 1812, for the general uses and purposes of said Board.

19. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund to be known as "The Thomas Hawley Fund". In memory of my grandfather, Thomas Hawley, and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Bridgeport Protestant Orphan Asylum, Bridgeport, Connecticut, for the general uses and purposes of said asylum.

20. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the American Bible Society, New York City, for the general uses and purposes of said Society.

21. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Connecticut State Park and Forest Commission of said state, and I request, but do not direct, that so far as possible said sum be expended in connection with the uses and purposes of said Commission now or to be hereafter effected in Fairfield County where I reside.

22. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to the State of Connecticut for the purposes of the Connecticut State Park and Forest Commission of said state, and I request, but do not direct, that so far as possible said sum be expended in connection with the uses and purposes of said Commission now or to be hereafter effected in Fairfield County where I reside.

manage, layest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Danbury Hospital, Danbury, Connecticut, for the general uses and purposes of said hospital.

23. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000) dollars in trust as a permanent fund to be known as "The Marcus Clinton Hawley and Sarah Booth Hawley Fund". In memory of my father and mother, and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, Incorporated under the laws of Massachusetts in 1812, for the general uses and purposes of said Board.

24. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the "American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions", Incorporated under the laws of Massachusetts in 1812, for the general uses and purposes of said Board.

25. I have heretofore by a deed dated January 29, 1927, under which deed The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, of Hartford, Connecticut, is trustee, made a reservation for the maintenance of the buildings and grounds of "The Hawley School" heretofore erected by me in said town of Newtown, and I now hereby confirm said deed which shall remain irrevocable for the uses and purposes herein specified unless I shall during my lifetime, revoke the same in accordance with its provisions.

26. It is my will that in the event my trust under said deed should ever fail or terminate, the fund in the hands of the trustee hereunder shall become a part of my rest and residue of my estate, and be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this will covering the disposition of such residuum.

27. I hereby direct my executors to pay out of my general estate, my herebefore disposed of, all succession, legacy or inheritance taxes, either State or Federal, chargeable against any estate or devise under this will.

28. All the rest, residuum and remainder of my estate, both real and personal, and whatsoever situated, including any property which may by lapse or failure of devise, gift or otherwise become a part of such rest and residuum, I give, devise and bequeath to "Yale University", New Haven, Connecticut, as a permanent fund to be known as the "Mary E. Hawley Fund." The income therefrom to be applied in general uses and purposes of said University.

29. In case any person to whom my legacy or devise or to whom my beneficial use or interest is given in this will shall oppose the probate of the same or endeavor in any wise to contest this will or to sue or proper execution such contestants shall thereby forfeit all right and title to any and all legacies, devises or provisions contained in favor of such contestants.

30. In case any person to whom my legacy or devise or to whom my beneficial use or interest is given in this will shall oppose the probate of the same or endeavor in any wise to contest this will or to sue or proper execution such contestants shall thereby forfeit all right and title to any and all legacies, devises or provisions contained in favor of such contestants.

31. I nominate and constitute and appoint my friend, Arthur T. Nettleton, of Newtown, and The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, executors of this my last will and testament, and the said The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, trustee hereunder, and I hereby direct that the said Arthur T. Nettleton shall not be required to furnish any bond for the faithful performance of his trust as such executor. I hereby authorize my said executors from time to time or at any time to sell all or any part of my estate, either real or personal, as they shall deem to be for the best interest of any said estate and said trustee shall have like power of sale with respect to property at any time held by it under any of my trusts created by this will and which it is the trustee. I further authorize my said trustee to continue to hold any property or securities owned by me at the time of my death though said property or said securities may not be of a kind in which trustee may, by the laws of the State of Connecticut, invest, and I authorize my said trustee from time to time and at any time to subscribe for or any increase in the capital stock of any insurance company which I may own at the time of my decease for that purpose, if necessary, sell other property or securities at any time held by my said trustee.

32. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) Dollars, which she would have received in paragraph 5 of my said will.

I also give, devise and bequeath the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust, as a permanent fund to be known as "The William Edmond Fund," and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the town of New Haven aforesaid for the purpose of maintaining, equipping and keeping in repair the buildings of said "The William Edmond Town Hall" and the care and upkeep of the grounds and premises appurtenant thereto and for such other expenses in connection with the use and upkeep of said town hall as may be the town deemed necessary or desirable. The trustee shall not, in the administration of said fund be required to see to the application of said payments of income by it to said town.

11. I give, devise and bequeath to said town of New Haven the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund to be known as "The William Edmond Booth Fund," in memory of my mother's only brother, Dr. William Edmond Booth, and for the uses and purposes following, viz: To hold,

Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund to be known as "The Cyrenius H. Booth Fund" and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom semi-annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the town of New Haven, Connecticut, during the term of his natural life in recognition of his long and untiring devotion to my interests, and upon his death, the principal thereof to become a part of the rest and residue of my estate and to be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this will governing the disposition of such residuum.

12. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars in trust as a permanent fund to be known as the "Thomas Hawley Fund" in memory of my grandfather, Thomas Hawley, and for the following uses and purposes, viz:

To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Bridgewater Protestant Orphan Asylum, Bridgewater, Connecticut, for the general uses and purposes of said asylum.

13. If at the time of my death I shall be engaged in the construction of any said buildings, viz: The Town Hall, Free Public Library or the Soldiers' Monument, the funds to erect which have been heretofore provided in this will for the town of New Haven, I direct my executors to complete the same at the expense of my estate, following or far as shall seem suitable to them in their discretion the plans, if any, existing therefor, I authorize my executors in their discretion to change such plans and so far as there shall not be any plans, I direct my executors to provide the same in their discretion. In the event said building or monument, or any of them, shall have been erected and completed during my lifetime, or otherwise provided for before my death, then and in that event the provisions for the erection thereof made in this will shall be void as to such as shall have been completed or for which provision shall have been made, but the provision for the support and maintenance thereof shall stand as herein made, unless specific provision in lieu thereof shall have been made by me before my death.

14. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of thirty-five thousand (\$35,000) dollars in trust, for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the Connecticut Children's Aid Society, Incorporated in 1898, for the general uses and purposes of said Society.

15. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to the State of Connecticut for the purposes of the Connecticut State Park and Forest Commission of said state, and I request, but do not direct, that so far as possible said sum be expended in consideration with the uses and purposes of said Commission on land or in land hereafter effected in Fairfield County where I reside.

16. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the New Haven Village Cemetery Association of New Haven, Connecticut, for the uses and purposes of said Association, including the care of the Hawley Memorial receiving vault and gateways and of the old part of said New Haven Village Cemetery.

17. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars, as a permanent fund to be known as "The Marcus Clinton Hawley Fund" in memory of my father, to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz:

To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom semi-annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the First Evangelical Society of New Haven, Connecticut, for the general uses and purposes of said Association under the direction of the Society's committee.

18. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to Dr. William Edmond Booth, and for the uses and purposes following, viz: To hold,

Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust the sum of fifty thousand (\$50,000) dollars, to hold, manage and re-invest and to pay the net income therefrom semi-annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to my friend, Arthur T. Neelton, of Newtown, Connecticut, during the term of his natural life in recognition of his long and untiring devotion to my interests, and upon his death, the principal thereof to become a part of the rest and residue of my estate and to be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this will governing the disposition of such residuum.

19. I give, devise and bequeath to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars in trust as a permanent fund to be known as the "Thomas Hawley Fund" in memory of my grandfather, Thomas Hawley, and for the following uses and purposes, viz:

To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this will governing the disposition of such residuum.

20. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, to the American Bible Society, New York City, New York, for the general uses and purposes of said Society.

21. I give, devise and bequeath the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to The Travelers Bank and Trust Company, Hartford, Connecticut, in trust as a permanent fund and for the following uses and purposes, viz: To hold, manage, invest and re-invest the same and to pay the net income therefrom annually, or oftener in the discretion of my said trustee, from time to time to my said trustee from time to time or at any time to sell all or any part of my estate, either real or personal, as they shall deem best for the best interests of any said estate and said trustee shall have like power of sale with respect to property at any time held by it under any of my trusts created by this will and which it is the trustee. I further authorize my said trustee to continue to hold any property or securities owned by me at the time of my death though said property or said securities may not be of a kind in which trustees may be held by the laws of the State of Connecticut. Invest and I authorize my said trustee from time to time and at any time to subscribe for any increase in the capital stock of any insurance company which I may own at the time of my decease for that purpose, if necessary, well other property or securities at any time held by my said trustee.

Cannon, is now dead, and now desire to revoke the gift of \$10,000 (\$10,000) made to him and to remember certain other employees not mentioned in said paragraph, now therefore, in addition to the bequests already provided for by said paragraph 8, with the exception of the gift to the said Patrick H. Cannon, so revoked as aforesaid, I do give and bequeath to my employees John Pandorast, Michael F. Crowe and Jane Keating the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000) dollars each, as a token in reward of their faithful services to me, said sums to be theirs absolutely and to be paid in

the same manner as if said paragraph had been originally made in said paragraph.

2. WHEREAS since the execution of my said will my cousin Sarah E. Beers has deceased, therefore I do give, devise and bequeath the sum of Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars, while she would have received under paragraph 5 of my said will, to her two sons Henry Sanford Beers and Robert Edmund Beers, to be divided equally between them, share and share alike.

3. WHEREAS under paragraph 5 of my said will I have given to Marie R. Meyer and Edu Meyer of Dresden, Germany, the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000) Dollars each, I do hereby revoke said gifts and in lieu thereof give each absolutely the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000) Dollars instead of the sum so given to each of them in said paragraph 5 of my said will.

4. WHEREAS under paragraph 5 of my said will I have given to Carlton Hubbell of New Haven, Connecticut, George M. Stuart of New Haven, Connecticut, and Mary E. Hawley, (L. S.)

Subscribed, sealed and declared to be a codicil to her last will and testament dated the 26th day of August, 1925, by the said Mary E. Hawley, in the presence of us, who, in her presence and at her request, have hereunto set our names as witnesses in New Haven, Connecticut, this 18th day of October, 1925.
